President's Report

Temple Aero Modelers,

My family and I recently returned from a two-week visit to the Nation's Capital. During our time there, we had the opportunity to spend a day at the National Air and Space Museum's new Steven F. Udvar-Hazy Center near Dulles airport in Chantilly, Virginia.

The Center, which opened last December, is considered a companion facility to the National Air and Space Museum on the National Mall. The aircraft are displayed in huge open hangars on three levels: on the floor where you can walk among them, and on two levels suspended from the ceiling. The ceiling is 10 stories high with a series of skywalks that will bring you nose-to-nose with the hanging aircraft.

For me, the highlight of the museum experience was seeing the actual Enola Gay, the B-29 Superfortress which dropped the first atomic bomb during World War II. Our guide told us that the plane was specially built just for that mission. The plane also actually flew to the hangar just prior to the opening of the museum.

I was also amazed at how many huge aircraft were inside the hangar. Along with numerous small planes, there's an Air France Concorde, the Space Shuttle Enterprise, and the fastest aircraft ever built, the Lockheed SR-71 Blackbird, a reconnaissance aircraft. On its final flight, the Blackbird flew from Los Angeles to Washington, D.C. in 1 hour, 4 minutes and 20 seconds, averaging a speed of 2,124 miles per hour.

Organized by themes including Business Aviation, General Aviation, Commercial Aviation, Sport Aviation, World War II Aviation, Korean Conflict and Vietnam War Aircraft, Cold War Aviation, modern Military Aviation, Space Hangar, Pre-1920 Aviation and Vertical Flight, the Center is an exciting adventure for aviation enthusiasts.

If you ever find yourself in the Washington, D.C. area, I recommend taking a drive down the Dulles Toll Road to spend a day or two at this new museum. It's definitely time well spent.

INSTRUMENT PANELS from Mark Kallio

An easy and cheap way to obtain an instrument panel for that sport model is to look through a full-size airplane magazine for an advertisement showing instruments. I found one I liked and used my scanner to scan the image into the computer, and then pasted it into my word processor, scaling it to different sizes. This could also be done using a copy machine that will reduce. If using the computer, any size can be easily scaled, and I printed out several different sizes to have on hand. The ones I did were all in black and white, but if you have access to a color scanner and color printer, some really nice instrument panels can be created this way. You also could add color to black and white copied instruments using markers or colored pencils so they look more realistic.
