

The cloud cover burned off to a clear day. The wind was very fickle, it would change from North to East to South during a 60 second flight.

Bill Kunz won the Timed Loops and Rolls. Shawn won 2nd, BW 3rd, Bobby 4th and Frank came in 5th.

Bill also won the Spot Landing with BW in 2nd, Bobby came in 3rd, Jeff came in 4th and won the Entertainer of the Day Award with his Zagi, an electric powered flying wing. Jeff could not fly the first event without wheels, but he put on a great show in the Spot Landing and Balloon Bust. Jeff would hand launch his plane, come in about 10 feet above the circle, kill the power, slam the runway hard enough to make it bounce, turn power back on

and set up for the next approach. I didn't get a chance to check out his plane, but it was tough. I have never seen anyone throw his plane on the cement, then stomp it, before each flight. Frank won 5th place in this event. The wind was so fickle that only 6 balloons were burst with each pilot having 9 attempts. Bill, Shawn, Bobby, Frank, Jeff, and Steve Meyer all burst one balloon. Bill Kunz won the contest with B.W. in 2nd, Bobby Zikes in 3rd, Shawn Rasco in 4th, and Frank Sodek in 5th. We all had a good time. Dennis landed his Perfection fast and hard and broke the nose out of the plane, the fuel tank bounced across the runway. He had it ready to fly the next round and stalled on landing, re-broke it, so he threw in the towel. Steve Reinke crashed on landing also. Charles's aileron pulled loose and piled in the pit area only a few feet from the other planes.

Fun Fly CD

Combat League Report for 07/08/01

Four brave hearted souls showed up for combat, but only 3 would fly. Steve Meyer was having radio problems so he decided to sit this one out. Bobby Zikes was flying a new pink version of his custom built "Postal" fighter; Don Mondrik was there with his black and yellow "Com.Bat" Gremlin; I had my patched up "T4" Gremlin. After a few test flights, we tied on the streamers.

With only three planes flying, I figured it would be a relatively dull day of combat... boy was I wrong! Bobby drew first blood, then I shaved a couple of feet off his streamer. A little past midpoint through the round, Don & I got together! We both kept flying, but Don's plane was

being a bit difficult so he opted to land. My plane continued to fly well so Bobby and I finished out the round without incident. Upon inspection, Don's plane was missing about 3/4ths of each vertical stabilizer, 1/2 of his elevon had broke loose from the rest, and there were several gashes in the foam wing. We glued and taped cardboard on the elevon and taped a few other strategic places and had it ready for another round. The only sign that my plane was involved was some blue and yellow paint on the prop. No damage! I did score a cut during the mid-air.

Second round we managed to stay away from each other. I scored two cuts and Bobby got one. The Third round had barely begun when Bobby and Don hit each other. Don's plane went into a deadstick flat spin, coming out of it just above the trees. He was able to glide it down gently behind the trees. It only suffered a dented leading edge. Bobby's plane lost 1/3^d of a wing. His engine continued to run, pulling it down. He flipped the parachute switch, but it failed to deploy. It suffered a broken motor mount on impact. (Bobby had just finished building this plane the night before... sniff!) I landed since there were no "targets" left in the sky. No cuts were recorded.

Since Don's plane only had a dented leading edge, he was ready to go at it one-on-one! We cranked it up for a test flight, but a problem with the fuel tank clunk prevented us from flying another round.

Thanks to Fred Huber being the timekeeper for the rounds.

Nats Report

During the week of July 16th the Pattern Nationals were held at the AMA national flying site and headquarters in Muncie, Indiana. This is our flying site. We as AMA members paid for it with our AMA dues and it is a first class facility. There are three runways, two paved and one grass. All are about 800 ft long.

There were 128 competitors in pattern at the Nats this year, which is kind of a small turnout. There were 38 in the Masters class that I fly. The FAI class that Todd Blose flies had 36. Myself, Todd Blose and his dad Max Blose arrived in Muncie on Friday the thirteenth at about 8:30pm. Saturday morning we were at the national flying site by 8:00 am for a full day of practicing and getting acclimated to the layout of the sites. Sunday we also practiced at the National site until about 3:30 before pilot checkin and pilot meetings.

Competition started on Monday morning at 8:00 for FAI and Intermediate classes. Masters and Advanced classes flew in the afternoon. Competition in general can be stressful and nerve racking. Competing at the Nationals is even more so. You cannot imagine the adrenaline when you are on the line at the Nationals. I have been competing at the Nats for over ten years and I still love it. To know you are competing against the best guys in the country really shows you where you are in the skill level. We see a lot of the same people every year and lots of new ones as well, it is interesting to see what people do in different parts of the country.

We had a very good trip overall with Todd finishing 9th place in the FAI finals and I finished 5th in the Masters finals. Todd would have finished higher but he was over the sound limit on his first finals flight which zeroed that flight. His second flight he had a flame out and basically zeroed that round as well. We only flew three rounds in the finals so two zeros killed any chance of Todd finishing higher than 9th. I made the finals in 7th place and moved up to 5th and flew well, not quite my best but I was very happy to finish where I did.

Repairing Dings and Dents

Have you ever had a dent in a balsa leading edge? Try fixing it with water! Get a small diabetic syringe and put water in it. Inject a little water into the balsa into and around the dent in the leading edge. Heat the area with your covering iron. When the water starts boiling, it will build pressure and push the balsa out to its original shape. (Courtesy Victor A.)


