



**Safety Report**

In all the years I've been a member of this club, there has never been a serious accident at our field. This is largely a reflection of the safety consciousness of our membership as a whole, but I think it is also in part due to luck. I say this, because I have been present at the field on several occasions where there have been some very close calls.

A recent email that was forwarded to me really made me stop and think of the fine line between a club's perfect safety

record and a tragic accident that could change a club forever.

It seems that a club in the Houston area experienced a fatality at their field when a club member was struck in the throat by a helicopter blade. I don't know all the details, but the tragic chain of events unfolded when there was apparently a delay in locating a phone to call 911, and then the EMS unit was delayed in arriving because they could not find the location of the field. By the time help arrived, the injured man had bled to death.

Let's all make it our number one priority that nothing like this ever happens at our field. I think we already have the communication issue covered, since most members seem to own a cell phone. As far as giving directions to our field, I am posting our G.P.S. coordinates in the pit area. By the way, they are N31deg. 12.673' and W97 deg. 28.701'. Then, there is the task of trying to give directions on how to get to our field to someone who might not be familiar with the area. Add the stress of having to do this in an emergency situation, and it has the potential of becoming a difficult task. I, for one, am not good at giving directions.

Should we have an "official" set of direction to our field? If we did experience an emergency at our field, does anyone have any EMT training of any kind? Should we practice what to do if we had to deal with a serious accident? These are some of the issues we will need to deal with in order to make flying at our field as safe as possible.



