



Meeting Minutes (January meeting)



Called to order by President Mark Cullison at 7:30pm

New Members/Visitors: Ron Norman. Ron was a member of the club back in the 1970's flying control line aircraft. He was an owner of R&J hobbies for a few years

until his work took him away from the club and the shop in 1996. Due to a toy helicopter at Wal-Mart he has gained a renewed interest in the sport and will be joining the TAM once

again.

Minutes: Minutes from the meeting held in November of 2007 were read by Lance Starzyk; a motion to accept the minutes as read was made by Andy Sonnier and 2nd by Larry Macie.

Treasurer's Report: The report was read by Treasurer, Buster Hinkle, motion to accept the report was made by Fred Huber and 2nd by Doug Staines.

Club member Recognition: Mark thanked Frank for taking over and producing a fine first newsletter. Frank pointed out that Mark had published the previous 151 monthly newsletters (~14 years) greatly facilitating his duties as newsletter editor.

Old Business: Doug Staines reported that all the new trees were sold. One tree was replaced and one more may need to be replaced. This officially ended the tree project.

New Business:

Meeting Venue Change: Due to a Ronald McDonald House schedule conflict, the June 2nd and November 24th TAM meetings will be held at the Temple Airport Conference Room.

Fly-In-The-Taco-Soup: Scheduled for Sunday, February 3rd at 12 noon. Mark asked who would be available to support with the cookout. Larry Macie volunteered to provide the food, drinks, and supplies as well as cook the food.

Beginners' Night: Some of the JR training radios need batteries replaced. Paul Horan clarified from Mark that the students still have flight time priority at the Wednesday night events.

Mall Show: The members present were asked if the club should still have the Mall Show. The question stemmed from an effective time management question regarding the fact that the club generated more raffle money at the Friday night Air Show than during a whole weekend spent at the mall. After some group discussion, it was suggested that the show provided more than just ticket revenue; it was put to a vote and passed in favor of having it.

Flying Field: The field looks good but sand burs were once again a developing problem. Mark suggested that the club reinstate the spraying program put on hold by last year's flood. Also a purchase of MSMA for the infield area containing newly planted Bermuda Grasses. Buster volunteered to purchase a container of the product.

- Native Grasses: Mark also commented that the club should invest in planting some native grass seed out in the field during our hopefully rainy spring in order to fill in bare spots to deter the growth of sand burs. Lance reminded everyone that this is an ongoing battle and

keeping the field mowed is important factor in limiting sand bur production.

- Mowers: Doug added that Randy (absent) said one of the mowers required maintenance and should be brought to Empire Seed in Temple for new blades and oil changes. Doug motioned the club to accept this....2nd? Vote passed.
- Runway Maintenance: The runway resealing project passed last year was put on hold due to the flood. It was suggested that it be done sometime after the Temple Air Show when the weather was warmer. Buster indicated this project previously cost about \$1,000.

Morgan's Point Event: The city of Morgan's Point is having a "Fund for City Parks" event on June 21, 2008 and would like the club to provide a static display and demonstration. It was suggested that flying foamy aircraft would do. Paul Horan volunteered to get with Pat Kubacak from Morgan's Point to get the specifics of this event.

Doug Staines: Former TAM president and newly appointed AMA district VP Doug Staines had several items to discuss:

- Pylon Racing: Doug asked the club if they would be interested in allowing the field to be measured and fit with PVC pylons for "Club 40 Pylon Racing". The question was raised about safety and Doug indicated that the pylons would not create an obstacle for regular flying. He offered to email out the Pylon Racing Rules and Calendar of Events. Doug motioned to approve, Paul Horan 2nd the motion.
- As AMA District 8 VP, Doug is encouraging all of the AMA clubs in his area to become a "Leader Club Member". He reviewed the requirements and indicated that TAM is at least eligible to meet the Bronze Award level.

Combat: The Bryan Club combat date at our field is May 18th. They have invited us to their combat event on September 14th. The club has tabled the decision to adjust our combat schedule due to the combat dates being only one week apart.

Spread Spectrum: Paul Horan commented on a programming ID error with Futaba spread spectrum radios. This issue is specific to the 6EX and 7C Futaba radios and may only pose a threat to other Futaba spread spectrum radio users. He also noted that Futaba is remedying this problem for free.

Raffle Plane: Frank Sodek Jr. motioned to order/purchase the raffle plane at this time. Another Raptor was suggested due to its popularity at last year's Air Show. Motion was 2nd by Fred Huber and approved by member vote.

Trip Reports: None

- 1) Cliff's trainer ran out of fuel, stalled and was caught by a tree at the north end. Damage was minimal.
- 2) Larry Macie Lost radio signal of his Something Extra and totaled it in the pasture. This was the second and final life for that aircraft, having crashed before.

- 4) Frank Sodek had a midair with his Big Stick and Larry Macie's airplane.

Larry Macie was voted by members to receive the Blunder Award.

Club 40 Pylon Racing

What is it? It's an entry level class for Radio Controlled Pylon Racing that is affordable, club friendly and a lot of Fun! The Club 40 Racing Class is set up to make it as even and fair as possible for all participants.

All participants use one of two allowed planes: either the **Sky Raider Mach II** or the **LA Racer**; both are made by 'World Models' and distributed in the USA by 'Airborne Models' at <http://www.airborne-models.com/index.asp>. They are sold or can be ordered in various local Hobby Shops, including the Waco Hobby Stop.

The planes are built **TOTALLY STOCK** and to the provided instructions, with no speed enhancing modifications such as lightening holes, streamlining, changing the landing gear, etc.

Two sub-classes can be run within the Club 40 Class, one for the novice pilot and the other for the more advanced pilots; the only difference is in the engine choices.

In the Novice Class any 40 size small frame bushing engines are allowed such as the OS LA 40, OS FP 40, Magnum 40, Tower 40, etc.

In the Advanced Class any 40 size ball bearing engines with a retail price of \$120 or less are allowed, with the Super Tiger 40 or the Thunder Tiger Pro 40 being recommended.

In either sub-class, all engines must be **STOCK** - no speed enhancements are allowed and must include the stock carburetor and muffler with the baffles.

Races consist of 4 planes running 10 laps around 2 Pylons placed 400 feet apart. The action is fast, furious and above all, a ton of fun.
